This term our topics include Ourselves and Autumn which will be covered through the Early Learning Goals. The things we will be studying in each Area of Learning are as follows:

Communication and Language

- Listening and joining in with stories, rhymes and songs
- Learning new vocabulary associated with parts of the body
- Repeat words and phrases from familiar stories
- Be aware of the listener in conversations
- Remain on topic in discussions
- Begin to use more complex sentences
- Use talk to connect ideas

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Seek out others to share experiences
- Working together in groups
- Responding positively to new activities
- Make connections between different life experiences
- Show increasing independence in selecting and carrying out activities
- Persist for extended periods of time on self-chosen activities

Physical Development

- Developing fine motor control and use of tools: food-linked activities such as chopping, slicing, spreading, kneading etc.
- related Music and movement to harvest, flowers, scarecrows
- Using a range small and large equipment
- Demonstrate increasing control over clothing and fastenings
- Observe the effects of activity on the body
