We would like to remind you of the importance of reading. Good readers make for good writers! All children are expected to read to an adult at home, daily. This can be recorded in their Reading Record Books. We also ask that children practise their times tables frequently bearing in mind that the Statutory Multiplication Check is just around the corner. All children have been taught how to access Times Table Rockstars independently, so please do make use of this subscription.

Reading

Good readers make for good writers. It is important that we support the children in becoming resilient learners who read for pleasure.

Regular reading is essential in Year 4, so we ask for the children to be read with as much as possible at home. We recommend that all children - even confident readers who prefer to read to themselves, are heard reading aloud daily.
