🐰 International Dress Day – Friday 17th October


Children are encouraged to come to school dressed in traditional clothing that reflects their cultural background. This celebration of identity helps foster pride and appreciation for our diverse community.



YEAR 1

In Year 1 Art lessons this term our topic this term is Drawing: Marvellous Marks! The children had great fun exploring different lines and patterns using felt tip pens. Together they made a master piece while being creative and practising their fine motor skills.







YEAR 2

Year 2 have had a busy week this week! We have been learning about working systematically in Maths as well as writing our beautiful narratives about Florence Nightingale which are displayed in our classroom! We have been to our new library and read in groups, sharing our favourite parts of our new books. In Science, we carried out an investigation all about our heart beats, we tested many different forms of exercise to see which one made our hearts work the hardest. We also had a special visitor of Deacon Arthur who came to talk to us about our RE topic of Beginnings. We were given lots of new, lovely information and the children answered lots of questions.

YEAR 3

In this week's Year 3 PE lesson with Mr B, the children took part in a variety of fun and engaging games designed to develop their ball skills. The activities focused on improving coordination, accuracy, and teamwork, with pupils working both individually and in small groups. Throughout the lesson, they showed great enthusiasm and perseverance, encouraging one another and demonstrating growing confidence in their ability to control and pass the ball effectively. It was a positive session that supported both their physical development and social skills.

YEAR 4

Year 4 have become Scientists this week conducting an observational experiment on eggs. They have been learning about teeth this term and since egg shells are made out of a similar material to teeth, year 4 have been experimenting with how different liquids affect our teeth. Children chose liquids such as coke, apple juice and water to observe how the shells change over a week.







YEAR 5

This week, Year 5 thoroughly enjoyed exploring electrical conductivity through hands-on experiments! The children built their own circuits and tested everyday materials to discover which ones conduct electricity and which ones act as

insulators. They were amazed to see how the brightness of the light bulb changed dramatically when testing different materials. Through their investigations, the children learned why certain materials, like copper, are used in electrical wires, and how insulators help keep us safe around electricity.









YEAR 6

This term, Year 6 have been deepening their understanding of multiplication by using a wide range of manipulatives to represent different problems. From counters and cubes to arrays and number lines, pupils explored how multiplication can be visualised in multiple ways, helping to strengthen their conceptual understanding. Building on this, the children investigated square and cube numbers. They discovered that square number arrays form perfect squares, while cube number arrays create solid, three-dimensional cubes. This hands-on approach made abstract concepts much more tangible and engaging.
