


Activity ideas for 'The Lighthouse Keepers Lunch' Week beginning 15.06.20

- Read the story of 'The Lighthouse Keepers Lunch' and ask questions about the text. Pick out tricky words and see if they can read and spell them.
- Write as a list or in simple sentences what they would like for lunch if someone was sending it to them (can use basket template attached) then draw items and colour.
- Write a thank you letter to someone in your house who makes you lunch or dinner.
- Create a wanted poster for the naughty seagulls for stealing the Lighthouse Keepers lunch!
- Read other stories from the collection, they can be found on YouTube, how are they similar/different:



- Find out about people who can help us particularly lifeguards and the RNLI. Draw a picture of them and write some facts about these people.
- Talk about healthy eating – what would make a healthy lunch?
- Go on a bird hunt. Count how many different types of birds can you see in your garden or when you go out. Can you see any seagulls? Make a pictograph of all the birds you can find.
- Find different types pebbles/stones in your garden. Sort them by colour/size/shape. Count how many you find and then write/paint the numbers on the top. Can you put them in order? Get someone to point to any given number, can you count on or back from that number? Get someone to hide some of them, can you guess which ones are missing.
- The lighthouse is a cylinder shape, go on a shape hunt around your house, how many cylinders can you find? What other 3D shapes do you have in your house and can you name them?
- Craft ideas:
 - Use the card from a kitchen roll, plastic/paper cup or plant pots and make your own lighthouse



- Make a collage picture of a lighthouse with scraps of paper/card etc



- With help from an adult make your very own lighthouse keepers lunch and have a picnic in the garden.
