

Activity ideas for the seaside. Week beginning 22.06.20

- Read the story of 'Harriet Adrift' and ask questions about the text. Pick out tricky words and see if they can read and spell them.
- Write as a list or in simple sentences the things they would need to do to stay safe at the beach.
- Recount a time they have visited the beach, what activities did you all do, what was the weather like, what did they like best, was there anything they didn't like or scared of?
- Read other books about the seaside – 'Lucy and Tom at the seaside' by Shirley Huges, 'What the Ladybird heard at the seaside' by Julia Donaldson, 'Sneakers the seaside cat' by Margaret Wise Brown. Discuss similarities and differences between the books.
- Watch Magic Grandad at the seaside (You Tube). Talk with a grown up about how the beach was different in the past to how it is now.
- Get all your members in your family to make a list of all the things you can do at the seaside. How many different things did you all come up with? Who thought of the most?
- Ask your family and friends what their favourite flavour ice-cream is, make a pictograph of your findings.
- Can you find any shells in your garden or when out and about on a walk or at the park? Sort them by colour/size/shape. Count how many you find and then write/paint the numbers on

the top. Can you put them in order? Get someone to point to any given number, can you count on or back from that number? Get someone to hide some of them, can you guess which ones are missing.

- Craft ideas:

- Draw a seaside scene or picture of the rock pools or even an underwater scene.
- Make a paper plate porthole- draw what they would see if they were looking out of one.



- Collect toothpaste, cereal, egg boxes, toilet/kitchen rolls and shiny wrapping, bubble wrap and anything else you can find to make boat or seaside scene.
