Grammar and Punctuation

The present perfect uses **have** and **has** as auxiliary verbs.

I have learnt to dance the galliard today. (*The galliard was a rather energetic dance!*)

He has learnt to play the lute this week. (*This is a string instrument, a bit like a guitar!*)

We often use the present perfect tense to show that an action has been completed recently.

I have polished your armour for you, my lord.

This means job done, but the squire has probably only just finished polishing the armour.

Usually when we use **have** or **has** we use the normal past tense form of the verb.

Past

I **finished** sharpening your sword.

Present perfect

I **have finished** sharpening your sword.

As we have seen most verbs use the **ed** form of the verb when using *have* or *has*.
But there are some verbs that use a different past form.

Past

I **spoke** to his Lordship recently.

Present perfect

I have **spoken** to his Lordship recently.

You need to learn the ones which are different. Here are some of the most common ones:
