# Grammar and Punctuation

## I can use speech marks in direct speech.

**Speech marks** are often called inverted commas. They look like this “.....”

*Inverted commas go around the actual words that people say. They go at the start and at the end of speech.*

“I will rescue the fair maiden from the dragon,” said the knight.

*When speech starts the sentence it will end with a comma, an exclamation mark or a question mark.*

“I need my armour cleaning,” said the knight.

“I’m really tired!” said the page.

“What time did you go to bed?” asked the knight.

# Grammar and Punctuation

## I can change direct speech to reported speech. ✕

There are two types of speech: **direct speech** and **reported speech**.  
Direct speech is when you use the actual words that someone has said.

Has anyone got a tin opener?

"Has anyone got a tin opener?" the knight asked.

Reported speech is when you write what someone has said in your own words.

The knight asked if anyone had a tin opener.

The tense changes to the past tense (**has** changes to **had**) because you are reporting something that has already been said.
